III. THE FIRST DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI ON THE AVENUE OF GIANTS 2009

The Redwood High School Distinguished Alumni "Avenue of Giants" honors graduates of Redwood High School who have made a significant contribution to society or achieved substantial professional success.

Our honorees are of such exemplary character and achievement as to be worthy of emulation by current Redwood students and have graduated at least fifteen years ago. This year, the first year of the award, we honor:

Steve Fainaru (1980), a *Washington Post* correspondent, won the Pulitzer Prize for International reporting in 2008 for his stories on how private security contractors in Iraq operate outside the law. He was also a finalist for this award in 2006. His book, Big Boy Rules, on this same topic was published this spring. He has worked for the *Post* since 2000, where he also worked as an investigative reporter on topics ranging from civil liberties to sports. He worked for the *Boston Globe* for 11 years and is co-author of The Duke of Havana: Baseball, Cuba and the Search for the American Dream. B.A., University of Missouri, M.A., Columbia University

Don Francis, M.D., D.Sc. (1960) has provided leadership in the discovery and control of HIV, the eradication of smallpox, and the control of Ebola hemorrhagic fever. He initially directed the AIDS laboratory at the Center for Disease Control, and his early warnings about AIDS were chronicled in Randy Shilts' *And the Band Played On* about the beginnings of the AIDS epidemic. He received his M.D. at Northwestern University and his Doctor of Science in Virology at Harvard University. In 2004, he co-founded Global Solutions for Infectious Diseases (GSID) and serves as Executive Director and principal investigator for their dengue fever program.

The Honorable Gavin Newsom (1985) is the youngest San Francisco mayor in more than 100 years. His decision to grant marriage licenses to same sex couples gained worldwide attention for the issue. He initiated the plan to bring universal health care to all of the city's uninsured residents. He has established other programs ranging from harnessing local solutions to global climate change to easing the problems of the homeless. A likely candidate for Governor in the next election, he is also a founder of PlumpJack, an enterprise of wineries, restaurants and hotels. B.A., Santa Clara University.

Martha Olney, PhD (1974) an Adjunct Professor of Economics at the University of California, Berkeley, was a recipient of the Distinguished Teaching Award in 2003 at Cal and was awarded the Distinguished Teaching Award from the University of Massachusetts-Amherst in 1991 along with numerous other teaching awards. She also presents workshops on teaching to the Berkeley faculty & graduate students and teaches economics to high school teachers in summer professional development programs. She was a co-author of Essentials of Economics with Paul Krugman, the 2008 Nobel Prize winner in economics, and has published many other economics texts. B.S., University of Redlands (magna cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa); PhD, University of California, Berkeley

Ambassador Dennis Ross (1966) was appointed in February 2009 to be Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton's negotiator to develop strategies for working on the complexities of the United States' relationship with Iran. He also served as a top Middle East envoy in the administrations of Presidents George H.W. Bush and Bill Clinton. Ross is the author of The Missing Peace, in which he detailed his work to forge accords in the Middle East. He was awarded a Presidential Medal by President Clinton and has received the State Department's highest award twice. His most recent book Statecraft and How to Restore America's Standing in the World was termed "important and illuminating" by the *New York Times*. BA: University of California, Los Angeles; PhD, University of California, Los Angeles

Eric Schmitt (1978) currently reports on terrorism issues for the *New York Times*, where in 1999 he was part of a Pulitzer Prize team of reporters who investigated how China was able to obtain sensitive U. S. military technology. Since joining the *Times* staff in 1983, Mr. Schmitt has reported from Congress, the Pentagon, Iraq, Afghanistan, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Haiti and Somalia and covered the 1991 Persian Gulf War. He was one of the primary reporters assigned to the impeachment proceeding against President Bill Clinton. He served as assistant to senior columnist James Reston when he first came to *the Times*. He attended Harvard University's program on National and International Security in 1991, and was awarded a Knight Journalism Fellowship to Stanford University in 2006-07. B.A., Williams College

Dina Temple-Raston (1982) is a correspondent for National Public Radio, where she covers counter-terrorism. She was City Hall Bureau Chief for the *New York Sun* and formerly worked for *Bloomberg News* in Asia, where she was responsible for opening Bloomberg's Shanghai and Hong Kong offices. She was White House correspondent for *Bloomberg News* for both terms of the Clinton administration and is the author of four books. Her first, *A Death in Texas*, was chosen by the *Washington Post* as one of the best books of 2002. She has also written books on Rwanda and civil liberties in America post-911. Her most recent book, *The Jihad Next Door*, is about homegrown terrorism in America. She speaks Chinese, Arabic, and French. B.A., Northwestern University; Liaoning University, Shenyang, China; M.A., Columbia University

Jay Weaver (1973) has been a legal affairs reporter for the past ten years at the *Miami Herald*, where he covers the state and federal courts. In 2001, he was part of a *Herald* team that won the Pulitzer Prize for its coverage of Elian Gonzalez, a six-year-old Cuban at the center of an international custody battle. Weaver and his colleagues detailed the pre-dawn federal raid to seize the boy from his Miami relatives and reunite him with his Cuban father. This year, the *Miami Herald* nominated Weaver for a Pulitzer Prize for his series showing how South Florida doctors and clinics defrauded the federal Medicare program of billions of dollars. As a result of his work, judges imposed tougher prison

sentences, Congress sought greater oversight of Medicare, and claims totaling hundreds of millions of dollars were denied. Earlier, after the Florida presidential election dispute in 2000, Weaver contributed to a *Herald* staff book, Democracy Held Hostage. Weaver got his start in journalism at the *Daily American* in Rome, Italy. B.A., University of California, Berkeley

Donald Kreps (Redwood High School's Principal 1957-1979) is recognized in this one-time-only non-alumni award for his inspirational leadership which created the foundation for the quality of education at Redwood High School. He was the founding Principal of Redwood, creating spirit and high expectations for students and staff alike. His qualities of mentorship, high ethical standards and kindness permeated Redwood during his tenure. He allowed staff and students to challenge themselves in creating a positive educational atmosphere. After resigning as Principal in 1979, Mr. Kreps stayed on at Redwood as a Math and Physics teacher before retiring in 1983. Following his retirement, he taught Math and Physics at The Branson School for an additional nine years. B.S., Stanford, M.A., Stanford

IV. ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

These people were honored at a dinner on Thursday, April 23rd.

The Hall of Fame is organized as a way of maintaining the rich heritage and tradition of successful athletic programs at Redwood High School. Many individuals have been influential in the Redwood tradition of excellence and have had exemplary accomplishments on the athletic fields. The Hall of Fame honors the contributions and accomplishments of these individuals who are worthy of recognition as examples for others to emulate and include Athletes, Coaches, and Special Contributors.

Athletes (by graduation year)

Pete Carroll (1969): Football, basketball, baseball - Carroll is the most successful Division 1 college football coach in the modern era, having led the University of Southern California since 2000 to an astonishing 88-15 record—a winning percentage of 85 percent. He spent 15 years in the National Football League, coaching with the Buffalo Bills, Minnesota Vikings, New York Jets, San Francisco 49ers and the New England Patriots. His greatest success has been as a college football coach. It is a niche that he occupies arguably better than any other current big university coach.

Jim Peters (1969): Football, basketball, baseball - Peters played three years at varsity level in all three sports, lettering each year and winning all-league honors in each. In his senior year, his teammates on all three teams honored him by naming him as their co-captain. In 1969, Redwood named him as its Senior Athlete of the Year. Peters went on to compete on College of Marin's football team in 1969 and 1970. During his two-year stint there he was named COM's Outstanding Athlete both years, and co-captained the team in 1970.

Mike Connor (1973): Football, basketball, baseball - Connor was All MCAL in the three sports he played from 1968 to 1973, earning a varsity letter in each of them, and at one time or another was team captain of each. He was named a Scholar Athlete in all three of his sports. That academic bent, along with his football abilities won him a full scholarship to Stanford University, where he played varsity football and lettered for four years, 1973-76.

Darrel Elder (1974): Track, basketball - Elder picked up the discus, which he had never before seen or tried, and threw it effortlessly and far, like a Frisbee. By the time he was a senior, Elder had notched the second longest high-school discus throw in the nation, 202 feet. Until 2002, Elder held the Marin County and NCS meet record of 194 feet 2 inches. Elder's prowess with the discus earned him a full-ride track scholarship at USC, where as a freshman he set the Pac 10 freshman record at the 1975 U.S.-Russia Junior Dual Meet. Elder later exceeded that distance, hurling the discus as a junior 195 feet, 2 inches, a performance that ranks seventh on USC's all-time list.

Buddy Biancalana (1978): Baseball - Biancalana played baseball all four of his years at Redwood, 1975 through 1978, garnering local and national honors along the way. In 1977 he was named to the Mythical National Champion Team, a squad composed of the best high school baseball players in America. He was drafted in the first round by the Kansas City Royals of the American league in 1982. Biancalana played shortstop for the Royals for 5 years and finished his career with the Houston Astros. In the fabled 1985 World Series that the Royals won against the St. Louis Cardinals, Biancalana capped an error-free 14-game post-season effort with a .278 batting average and an on-base percentage of .435.

Rod Berry (1979): Cross country, track - Berry is possibly the best distance runner Redwood ever produced. His school record of 4:12 in the mile still stands, as well as his Marin County records of 8:53 in the 2-mile and 29:13 in the 6-mile. As a senior, Berry was named to the All Northern California First Team in cross country, came in second at the National Junior Cross Country Championships, placed 10th in the World Cross Country Championships in Scotland and was named to the first team High School All American. In track, he took second at the state meet in the 2-mile, and later placed first in that event at the International Prep Invitational in Illinois. He was named Redwood's Athlete of the Year.

Caren Choppelas Horstmeyer (1980) Tennis, basketball, soccer, softball - Horstmeyer was named to either All League or All Northern California honors all four years that she played basketball. Redwood named her its Female Athlete of the Year in 1980. She earned a full basketball scholarship to Santa Clara. She was also named to the All NorPac Conference team in 1983 and 1984. After her distinguished college career, Horstmeyer played professional basketball in Greece for two years. She inevitably gravitated toward coaching the women's team at Santa Clara, where she twice won honors as West Coast Coach of the Year. The culmination of her career was being the head women's basketball coach at UC Berkeley from 2000 through 2005, where she won Pac 10 Coach of the Year honors in 2004.

Ken Flax (1981) Track and football - Flax was the best field man in Redwood's track history as well as tailback on the football team. In college, he earned numerous honors, championships and collegiate records for the University of Oregon. He became a standout in the hammer throw with his performances in the Summer Olympic Games at Seoul in 1988 and Barcelona in 1992. Track & Field News ranked him as the number-one U.S. hammer thrower in 1988, 1990 and 1991. He currently holds the third all-time longest hammer throw by a U.S. athlete, 262 feet, 3 inches.

Laura Starrett Schmitt (1982) Cross country, track, swimming - Laura Starrett Schmitt combines a brilliant years-long streak of high school, college and post-college athletic accomplishments with an unmatched devotion and closeness to Redwood. As an athlete, she compiled an impressive list of honors in all three sports, but track was her first love. She still holds the fourth fastest time ever in the MCAL for the 3200 meters (10:57), which is also a Redwood record. She continued her competitive career at UC Berkeley and in the USA and Masters programs. Since 2002, she has been Redwood's head track and cross country coach, winning an impressive 11 MCAL championships. Named Redwood's Coach of the Year in 2005, she has also taken two girls' cross country teams to the California state meet. All three of her children have run track or cross country at Redwood.

Chad Kreuter (1982): Football, basketball, baseball - Kreuter, who is the baseball coach at the University of Southern California, spent 19 years as a professional baseball player, including 15 years as a centerfielder at the Major League level, playing for the Texas Rangers, Chicago White Sox, Detroit Tigers, Kansas City Royals and the Los Angeles Dodgers. At Redwood, Kreuter was named three times to the All MCAL team, the Northern California All-Star team and the California All-Star team. He won a baseball scholarship to Pepperdine University in Malibu, California, and was a member of the Team USA that played in the 1984 World Games in Cuba.

Patty Gibian Monge (1984): Basketball, volleyball, softball, soccer - Monge, who lettered in four sports, received one of the highest honors ever bestowed on a Redwood athlete: having a perpetual award, the Patricia Joy Gibian Award, named after her. The award is bestowed on that senior girl who has given the most to her teammates, classmates and community. At Redwood, she received the CIF Exceptional Achievement Award for basketball in 1982 and was named to the MCAL All League First Team in 1983. Since high school, Gibian has won more than 80 gold, silver and bronze medals in the California Police and Fire Games, and 15 medals in the World Police and Fire Games, held in such venues as Calgary, Canada, and Melbourne, Australia. She holds the record for her age group in the half marathon (2001), and has run the grueling 120-mile Bakersfield to Las Vegas relay three times.

Kirsten McKnight Moore (1994): Basketball, soccer, softball - Moore lettered in basketball, soccer and softball during her years at Redwood. By her senior year, Moore, who remains Redwood's all-time leading girl scorer, was named the MCAL's Most Valuable Player and on the all-league team. After playing four years of basketball at the University of Oregon, Moore stayed on as the assistant women's basketball coach moving on to the assistant coaching position at the University of California at Berkeley. Now the head coach of the women's basketball team at Westmont College in Santa Barbara, her current team is ranked 13th nationally. Since 2007, Moore has also held the position of Associate Athletic Director for Westmont.

Coaches

Bob Troppmann (1958-1984): Football, basketball and track coach - Troppmann not only created the school's football program, but also a series of clinics and football camps that eventually earned him a spate of professional honors. His involvement with Redwood's varsity and freshman football teams over a 38-year span sticks in alums' minds. His varsity team from 1958 through 1969 won six district championships and three MCAL championships. His overall varsity win-loss record was 60-40-1. One of his top performers in the late 60's was a student named Pete Carroll, who later went on to considerable renown as a college and NFL coach. After his retirement from Redwood, Tropp became the District Athletic Director for the TUHSD in 1986 and 1987. He also acted the same year as the Project Manager of the Community Fields Association. In 1997, Redwood paid him tribute by naming the "Bob Troppmann Football Field."

Al Endriss (1958-1993): Baseball - Endriss was one of the first teachers founding principal Don Kreps hired in 1958, and when he left Redwood 35 years later in 1993, he was the last of the original faculty to go. Although he coached football for 15 years, it was his 21-year stint as the school's varsity baseball coach that made him a unanimous and virtually automatic choice as a Hall of Fame inductee, His record of 472 wins and 119 losses was equivalent to an astounding four wins for every game lost. His teams won 12 MCAL championships (including a remarkable eight-year run): 1965, 1967, 1970, 1972, 1973, 1974, 1975, 1976, 1977, 1978, 1979 and 1981. At the height of Endriss' tenure in 1977, Redwood was named "Mythical National Champion." Perhaps the crowning achievement was when Sporting News named the Redwood High varsity baseball team as the "Team of the Decade" for the 1970s.

Special Contributors

Phil Roark (1964-1999): Roark's coaching career at Redwood spanned 35 years in wrestling, football and baseball. He led his athletes to several league championships, including the 1968 MCAL wrestling championship, and the 1972 and 1973 MCAL varsity football championships. Roark was also a woodshop, drafting, PE and work experience teacher. In 1976, he was named Redwood's athletic director, a role he carried out for the next 22

years until his retirement in 1999. The awards he treasured most were his induction into the San Francisco State University Football Hall of Fame in 1990, his 1996-97 induction into the North Coast Hall of Fame, his 1998 induction into the Marin Athletic Foundation Hall of Fame, and, the same year, California State Recognition sponsored by Senator John Burton for his civic leadership and administration of athletic programs. After retirement, he was Commissioner of the MCAL from 2000-2007.

Donald Kreps, (Principal, 1957-1979): – Principal and Math teacher. Kreps started at Redwood a year before it opened its doors in 1958, the leader who directed the immensely complicated process of launching a school from scratch. Kreps furnished the campus and hired its staff and first coaches, including Coaches Al Endriss and Bob Troppmann. Redwood first honored Kreps by naming its faculty lounge after him. Now, it has followed up with twin tributes: His induction as a charter member into the Athletic Hall of Fame and his simultaneous induction into the school's Distinguished Alumni Avenue of Giants. Kreps's legacy also extended through his family: three of his children attended Redwood. He lives in Greenbrae, still near the school he did so much to create and sustain.
